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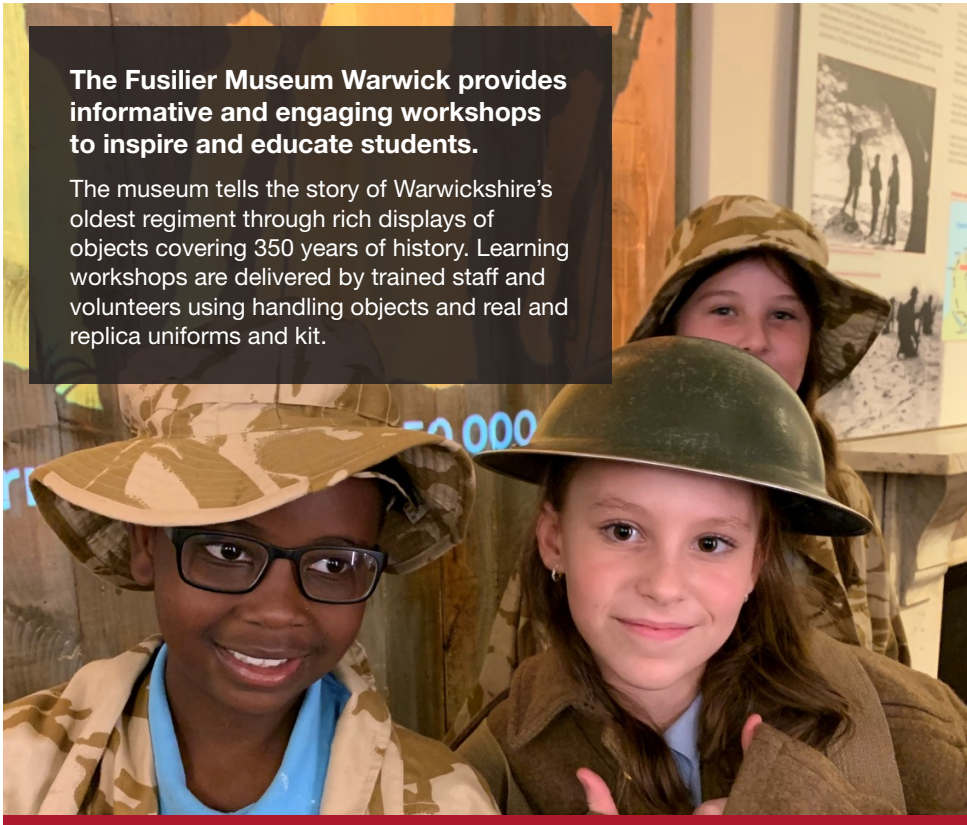

The Fusilier Museum Warwick provides informative and engaging workshops to inspire and educate students.

The museum tells the story of Warwickshire's oldest regiment through rich displays of objects covering 350 years of history. Learning workshops are delivered by trained staff and volunteers using handling objects and real and replica uniforms and kit.

TEACHER TRAINING SESSIONS

Our team offers teacher training sessions by appointment. These can be designed according to your needs but could include how to present local soldiers' stories using document facsimiles and handling objects. Alternatively, you could explore key historic events, like Dunkirk or D-Day, through the lens of people's stories and objects. These are £50/hour or free when you book two or more museum learning sessions.

OUTREACH SESSIONS IN SCHOOLS

The museum team can offer classroom-based workshops and assemblies in schools within the Warwick District. These will include trained and DBS-checked staff facilitators, the provision of worksheet resources, handling objects and real and replica uniforms and equipment.



MUSEUM LOAN BOXES

The museum has a range of loan boxes containing original objects for display or handling. These are available for hire from £10/month to £30/term. Themes include WW1, WW2, Home Front and Toys and Games.

The sessions offered are for museum workshops with an option to add a complementary classroom session to further enhance the learning experience.

THREE SOLDIERS 75 minutes | £75

In this session students find out about three remarkable soldiers from different periods of the regiment's history. Their investigation will include looking at historic objects and mannequins of each soldier. Using their findings and drawing on image and text resource sheets, the students will create a mini exhibition for public display.



The three soldiers are:

Hannah Snell, who disguised herself as a man to join the regiment.
William Amey, a Birmingham Chandelier maker who won the Victoria Cross and **Bernard Law Montgomery**, a successful Commander in WW2.

To give students the opportunity to delve deeper into the lives of these soldiers, there is an option for a preparatory 75-minute classroom session. This lesson will include worksheets and real and replica objects.

MUSEUM SESSIONS CAN BE BOOKED SEPARATELY OR PAIRED TOGETHER TO MAKE A FULL DAY OF ACTIVITIES



GET MARCHING! 75 minutes | £75

In this session, students learn about the role marching songs played for soldiers in the First World War looking at famous marching songs, including the regiment's 'Warwickshire Lads'!

To understand why marching songs were important, your group will explore the uniforms soldiers marched in, conditions for soldiers in WW1 trenches and why soldiers march. Using the regiment's own marching song, 'Warwickshire Lads', children will engage in an interactive workshop to learn about the advantages of marching.



OPTIONAL CLASSROOM SESSION - WRITE A MARCH!

75 minutes | £85

This option is designed as a creative extension of the museum-based workshop. Connected to the themes explored in the museum and using music specially created by Mayura Music, students will learn a chorus and write their own words to a new 'Warwickshire Lads' marching song.

CHANGING UNIFORMS

75 minutes | £75

In this session, students look at uniform design over the ages to investigate the different purposes of the soldier's outfit and how this changed over time. Students will have the opportunity to dress in different uniforms and handle real equipment carried by soldiers in the World Wars.

OPTIONAL CLASSROOM SESSION

75 minutes | £85

This session can be added as a preparatory workshop before the museum visit. This will allow students to get to grips with original source material. Real and replica objects will help them understand the different components in uniforms and how and why these changed over time.



POPPY DAY – REMEMBRANCE

75 minutes | £75

This session sensitively covers remembrance of soldiers who fell in war. Pupils will learn why we wear a poppy and will make their own to keep. As part of this session, there will be a visit to nearby St. Mary's church to view the Royal Warwickshire Regimental Chapel.



THE CHRISTMAS TRUCE – WILLIAM'S DIARY

60 minutes | £65

This session looks at the First World War diary entry written by Private William Tapp who described the moment on Christmas Day, 1914 when soldiers on both sides stopped fighting and shared gifts and photos. The session will include dressing up, role play and handling of real objects from the time.



CUSTOMISED LEARNING SESSIONS

The museum can offer a tailored approach to curriculum linked sessions for Key Stage 3 and beyond. Our particular strengths are case studies from the First and Second World Wars.

We can provide in-depth studies that will develop students' historical skills around enquiry, investigation, evaluation and interpretation.

CURRICULUM ENRICHMENT

We can offer bespoke activity days as part of Curriculum Enrichment. These could involve detail studies of, for example, life in the trenches in World War One. These will be richly supported by primary source material including documents.



LOCAL STUDY PROJECTS

The museum can offer tailor-made options for local studies, for example, Warwick and World War One. These studies can include a rich array of objects and archives as well as links to local monuments and buildings.

Guideline pricing is £85 for a 90-minute session

ASSEMBLIES

The museum can offer school assemblies for key stage 3 and 4 on the following:

Remembrance – In the period running up to Armistice Day, we can offer a thought provoking presentation on how and why we remember the fallen with examples from close to home.

Hannah Snell – This 'female warrior', disguised herself as James Gray to join the regiment in the 18th century. Her adventures created a best-selling book and stint on a West End stage.

Euan Lucie-Smith – The museum displays the memorial plaque belonging to the first British officer of mixed heritage to be commissioned in the First World War. The Anglo-Jamaican officer joined the Royal Warwickshire Regiment in 1914 making him part of Britain's national story.



OBJECT HANDLING SESSIONS



60 minutes | £65

We can offer tailor-made object handling sessions based around themes such as the First and Second World Wars. Students will have the opportunity to handle historical objects and listen to experts on their nature and use.

The museum archive now resides at Warwickshire County Record Office. Special complementary sessions at the museum and Record Office can be arranged by appointment.

3 workshop sessions (25 mins each):

- Medal making
- Why did uniforms become camouflaged?
- Caps and Jackets identification and dressing-up
- Time for shop



ACTIVITIES FOR 11+ YEAR-OLDS
 90 minutes | £3/student min. £50

Choice of workshops, each containing 3 sessions (25 mins each):

- **Pioneers and Rebels** – exploring three extraordinary soldiers of the regiment.
- **Stories from the Great War** – Remarkable soldiers of WW1 including a Victoria Cross winner and a famous cartoonist.
- **Changing Uniforms** – exploring the changing design of the regiment's uniforms from the Jacobite Rebellion of 1745 until modern-day operations in Iraq and Afghanistan.

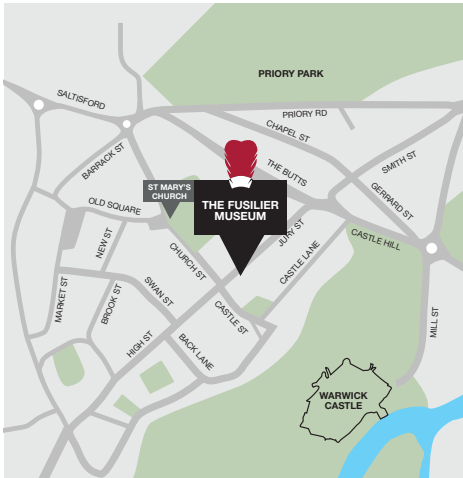

Toilets, including a disabled toilet, are situated on the ground floor. There is a stairlift for visitors with mobility impairment. The galleries are accessible for wheelchairs and there is BSL for the main audio presentations.

LUNCH ARRANGEMENTS

The museum has no café facilities. However, there is a breakout space that is suitable for Early Years, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 children to have their packed lunch. In dry weather, there is a small park immediately behind the museum that can be used for lunches.
